In the last few years, we've seen inspirational program impact moments at TheGifted Arts that continue to exponentially fuel our WHY. During this time, we've also faced great challenges, some of which have been with us since the agency's inception, but further complicated by the pandemic, such as access to funding and student retention. Yet and still, we persevered, as we have always done.

Our youth exhibit inherent persistence and resilience, consistently striving for greatness. As such, we took notes from their playbook. As we continued to push through, our families, community and supporters stood by us, carrying us along the way.

Our students embody agency values in their desire to educate, excite, empower, and inspire the community, with every opportunity they receive to present and perform. Over the last two years our GiftedArtists have been extremely busy learning and curating projects that speak to the essence of who they are now and who they wish to become, as well as a creative display of how they view society. As performers they are dedicated to their craft and work hard to ensure that each audience member leaves with a positive experience and thoughts on how they too can be good people and share joy with others.

Our overall growth has been expansive across program areas and the entire agency, which is fantastic because it reinforces that we are doing the right work that is valued by so many. Choosing to be a part of TheGifted Arts programs means young people are entering a space where they will be safe, seen and celebrated, by a dedicated team of individuals deeply invested in their growth and development. We also seek to ignite the inner creative, while cultivating a critical thinker that can navigate the complexities of the world in which we live.

Lastly, we want each child to have an opportunity to see, hear and experience artistic moments where they see themselves and naturally connect. We heard from 170 GiftedSummer campers and they reported an aggregate 99.2% overall enjoyment satisfaction rating. Our youth are developing artists, yes this is true, and they are growing in many ways that will prepare them for life, as one student reflects that "It's not always about how good you are, it's about how much effort you put in."

We have evolved from a collective of passionate volunteers to a team of seven dedicated paid staff members, steadfastly navigating through a global pandemic, social unrest, and isolation, all while facing budgetary challenges. Despite these obstacles, our resolve to co-create enduring experiences for the young people and communities we serve has only strengthened. After seven early years as a volunteer-run agency, our once nominal operating budget has increased by 80% from 2021 to 2023, as has our resolve. This substantial growth has afforded us greater capacity to excel in our mission: transforming the lives of youth through culturally

artistic experiences. Rest assured, we are unwavering in our commitment and have no intention of slowing down.





From serving 25 students in 2011, TheGifted Arts now enriches nearly 400 young people each year, through its own site-based programming and through formal partnerships with area elementary and middle schools and community partnerships. TGA takes great pride in cultural arts that celebrate and honor black and brown vouth. We have a niche focus on delivering high quality cultural performing arts programs, experiences and curricula, which include but are not limited to step, spoken word, Hip Hop dance, music, fashion performance and original theater productions rooted in celebrating and



PROGRAMS BY THE NUMBERS

GiftedAcademy is our year-round youth program offering culturally rich performing arts curricula. The core purpose is to create a safe space, where young people can explore their identity, discover their purpose and greatness. We use our custom formula and curriculum to promote personal power through artistic development to increase confidence, self-worth, and drive utilizing the skills of metacognition, exploration, reflection and presentation that will allow them to flourish in all areas of their lives. GiftedAcademy serves students in the kindergarten to twelfth grade in schools across the greater Raleigh-Durham Triangle area including charter schools.

In the season of 2022-2023, On a scale of 1-5, 96.1% of students rated their overall experience a 4 or 5. 95% of students reported feeling safe (knowing that you're cared for, loved and belong to a group, family and a community)

GiftedSummer is our unique, full-day, five-week specialty performing arts camp available for rising 3rd - 9th graders. Campers explore the world of dance, step, theater, fashion, and music weekly. TGA partners with other community members to curate a week filled with indoor and outdoor recreational and team-building activities, as well as a uniquely blended artistic and educational experience based on the theme of the week. At the end of each artistic week campers have the opportunity to apply and perform their new learned and improved skills during a camper-led showcase to their families and peers.



Performance Academy is our premier youth performance group and an extension of GiftedAcademy. This academy dedicates a space for students interested in deepening their technique training in Ballet, Modern and Jazz, as well as increased performance time as training progresses. Performance opportunities for these dancers include dance competitions, community affairs, and school partnerships. This unique group consists of fifth to twelfth graders. Across three seasons Performance Academy has completed 12 performances.



GiftedImpact offers performance demonstrations and free after-school programs for schools and community agencies, providing participants with an introductory experience in cultural arts. This initiative allows students to explore their gifts and talents, enhance their confidence, and develop artistic skills. TheGifted Arts aims to reach hundreds of students across various settings, creating a space where children feel acknowledged, secure, and celebrated. By hosting GiftedImpact at neighboring middle and elementary schools, the program effectively engages students from diverse backgrounds and identities without financial or transportation constraints. Students then have the opportunity to showcase their talents during school assemblies. Since 2021, GiftedImpact has served 382 students from kindergarten through eighth grade across five schools.

THEGIFTED ARTS EXPOSURE

We've found through surveyed data that upon entering TheGifted Arts on average 50% of our students come into the program with no prior arts education. As such, while the other 50% of students usually come in with a primary interest, all students enrolled are immersed in multidisciplinary cultural arts experiences. Students find themselves engaged in the process and training not only their bodies physically but mentally through exploration of all the arts and develop techniques that can apply across all art forms. We believe that all performing artists at their core are all around performers fusing together skills and techniques across disciplines to deliver a memorable performance.

ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGE OVER TIME

Since its inception, the growth of student enrollment among returning students has consistently continued. A brief overview from 2021 to 2023 reveals an average returning student rate of 65%. Consequently, each season witnesses an influx of new students who attend our programs due to their connections and curiosity about TheGifted Arts. Through our expansion into schools and performances within the community, our aim is not only to showcase the TGA culture but also to actively engage families and generate interest in the program.

Across all programs: Students receive performance/ creation training and development, coaching and informed positive beliefs around self-image and confidence. Our high schoolers receive college readiness and exploration and workforce/ entrepreneurship development. They attend leadership workshops and high school participants can complete our in-house workforce development program, where we are proud to offer paid job opportunities in our agency in our GiftedImpact and GiftedSummer programs.



Of the 20212023 staff, 65%
